SFCT ANNUAL ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2024

The annual accounts for the year ended 30 June 2024 are now available for members. The format is different to previous years as the Trust has grown and this requires more detail to be provided in the accounts. The final accounts show a surplus of £229,873, down from £368.377 for the previous year. This reduction is the impact from increased operational costs, higher grants awarded, spend on projects that are not assets and increased depreciation.

Administrative Expenses includes all costs that were not related to buying fixed assets (land, buildings, equipment) as these are reflected in the balance sheet values. It includes all grants paid out and expenditure on projects managed directly by the Trust such as the Pathways Project, events, repairs and maintenance and the Trust van, as well as depreciation relating to fixed assets.

The legacy fund investment will provide an income to the Trust and the Community beyond the lifetime of the current windfarm agreements. The current value of this fund as of 4 November 2024 was £1,466,979. Stock market investments can be volatile, and these investments are designed for long term financial planning.
